Course Description

This course will survey principal topics within microeconomic theory. Students will develop a sound comprehension of consumer theory, production theory, and market equilibrium concepts. In particular, we will consider how economic agents make optimal choices in the presence of resource constraints. Students will model the interaction of these economic agents under various market structures and critical assumptions that produce a unique market equilibrium. Time permitting, we may cover other auxiliary topics, such as game theory and behavioral economics.

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Grading Policy and Scale

Your grade in the course will be determined by two exams, homeworks, and in-class quizzes.

Exams: The exams are tentatively scheduled for May 26th and June 16th and will be held during our regular class time in our regular classroom. The exams will not be cumulative.

Homeworks: There will be four homework assignments due in Canvas through Smartwork5, two before Exam 1 and two before Exam 2. If all four homework assignments are completed, then your lowest score will be dropped when calculating your overall Homework grade.

Quizzes: In-class quizzes will be used to track your current understanding of the material. The quizzes will be announced beforehand with at least a one-day notice. The quizzes will be graded on a completion basis. So, if you are in class and you take the quiz, you will receive full credit. If you need to miss class on the day of a quiz, notify me beforehand. If you are absent without prior notification, you will not receive credit for the quiz.
